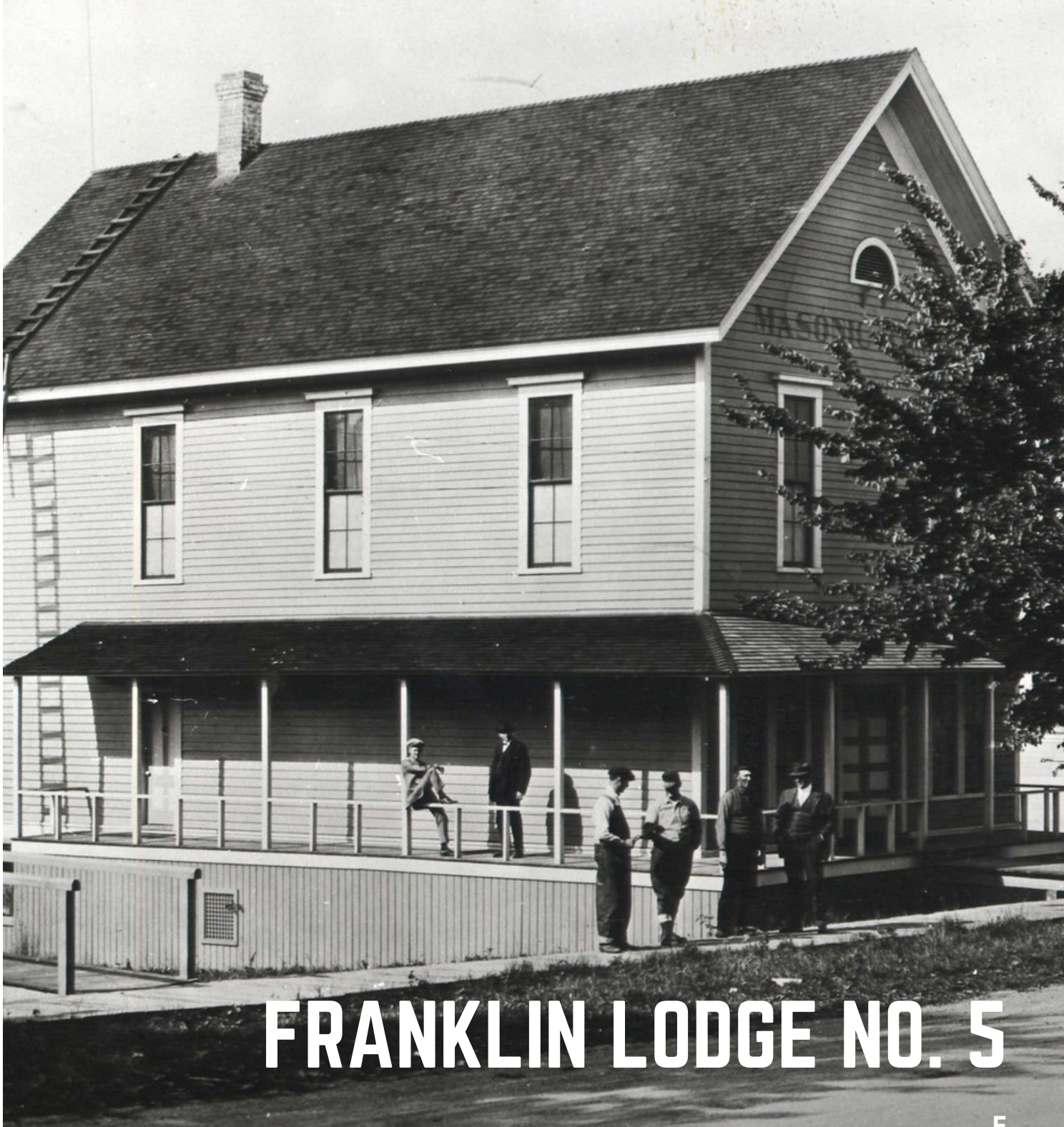

FRANKLIN LODGE NO. 5

Franklin Lodge is the oldest active Masonic lodge in Washington.

It was chartered September 6, 1859 when its eight original members carried a petition by canoe to Steilacoom.

The hall originally stood where the store is today. It wasn't turned around when it was moved here in 1907, so its original front entry is now on the back.

REPORTED ACTIVITY

There are two floors to this building.

Lodge: Franklin Lodge No.5 was only investigated for the Paranormal at the 2018 Port Gamble Ghost Conference. There were many reports of personal experiences throughout the Lodge, but mostly the Lodge Room located on the second floor of the building. Some female investigators have captured EVP recordings of men telling them to "Get Out" of the lodge room.



One particular experience stands out...During an investigation of the Lodge Room, many people witnessed the shadows of feet pacing outside the Lodge Room door. Investigator Pete Orbea quickly opened the door and found nobody in the vicinity of the doorway, downstairs, or even outside the building. Many people witnessed this experience. One of the Masons has spoken about the "presence" of a long-time lodge member who is felt near his old desk in the Lodge Room. We hope to continue investigations to see what evidence may come out of this historic location.
