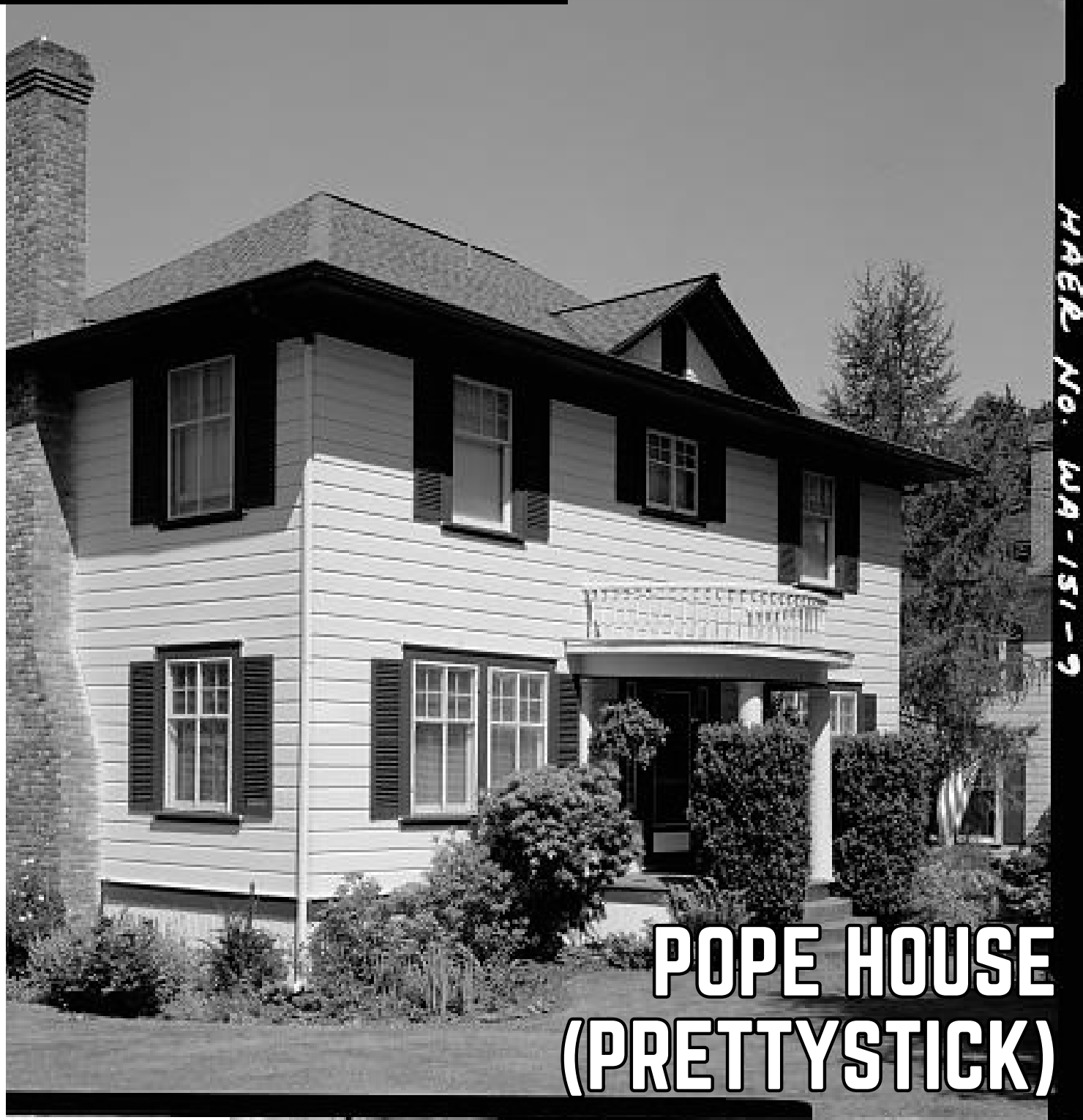

HISTORY

Built 1900 in Port Ludlow, WA for Pope family member Morrill Pope. The design of this home was more extravagant than the regular homes built for workers at the Port Ludlow mill.

This house was moved to Port Gmable by barge in 1929, some time after the Port Ludlow mill closing by 1925.

The first residents of the home once it was moved to Port Gamble, were doctors who began working at the new hospital that opened in 1929. That hospital was in the former Ames House located just in front of the Walker-Ames House where you see a fire pond today.

REPORTED ACTIVITY

There are two floors to this building.

Upstairs:
