HISTORY

The church's architecture and original Congregational affiliation echo the New England origins of its founding members, while the modesty of its design and execution reflect the frontier environment in which it was built. It was built to look like the Congregational church in East Machias, Maine. The presence of the church in Port Gamble is characteristic of a company town, as is the company's financial contribution to its support and the fact that its affiliation traditionally reflected the religious persuasion of the community's resident manager. Currently, Port Gamble Weddings hosts 70-80 weddings annually.

REPORTED ACTIVITY

Most of the report accounts of the paranormal center around audible sounds. Some have seen a woman and child to the left of the altar area. One experience that seems to happen more frequently is:

While in the basement, people hear what sounds like a wooden ball hit the floor above. The sound travels across the floor as if a ball is rolling across the floor. The sound seems to originate from left side of the sanctuary about half way down the aisle.
