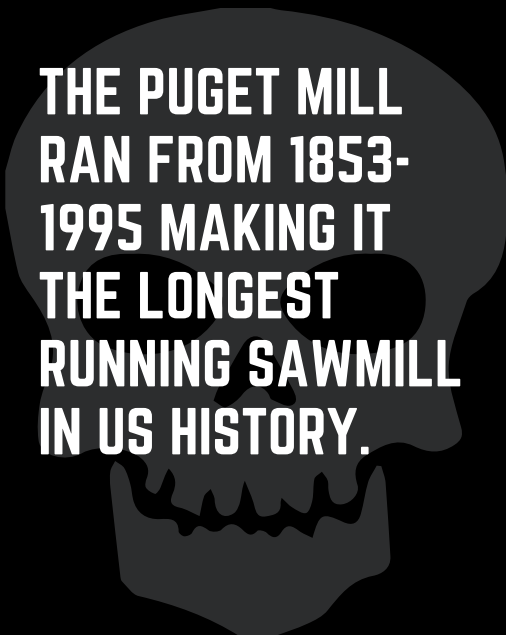

REPORTED ACTIVITY

There are two main areas of frequently reported paranormal activity.

One is the Puget Hotel Exhibit. While investigating from the area of the exhibit, shadows have been seen moving back and forth at the end of the hallway by the saw blades. Someone seems to walk by. In years past when EMF or KII meters are placed on the floor rounding the corner at the exhibit, something has set the meters off after seeing shadows moving about. There is also sounds of paper rustling and books closing coming from the back room

(accessed at the back of the Puget Hotel Exhibit (where bookkeeping typically took place). Take note of the imprint in the chair and wet bootprints in the Captain Talbot exhibit.



The Cyrus Walker Bedroom Set Exhibit has been a place where an apparition has been witnessed sitting the chair as if "she" looking out the window. She vanishes as soon as she is seen by museum patrons.
